ANGELA AVERIETT

Chief Averiett brings more than 26 years of experience in law enforcement. A significant portion of Averiett's career took place in Hayward, California, where she rose in the ranks from records clerk to lieutenant. In her 19 years with the Hayward community, Averiett served in the patrol and traffic divisions, and the internal affairs, community policing, and special duty (gang) units. Averiett was also team leader for critical incident stress management and peer support as well as assistant team leader for the crisis (hostage) negotiations unit.

In 2019, she served as the deputy chief for the Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART) Police Department, a 200-officer, full-service police department. She built out the Progressive Policing and Community Engagement Bureau, an award winning co-responder model of policing, from the ground up.

Chief Averiett assumed her position with the Los Altos Police Department on August 1, 2022, where she came in with hefty goals that she brought to fruition to enhance the overall operational effectiveness of the department. Angela proudly serves the Los Altos community, and her priorities are safety, accountability, fairness, and equity while striving to ensure the well-being of all who live, work, and travel through Los Altos.

Averiett holds a bachelor's degree in leadership and organizational studies from St. Mary's College (Moraga, California). She also graduated from the Alameda County Leadership Academy and the Los Angeles PD Leadership Academy.
